





A cross-Canada collaboration

in brain imaging will transform our understanding of the brain and open the door to better care for children from coast to coast, from birth through adolescence.

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Quebec children

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Brain health

You are the driving force behind a national imaging project

has a neurodevelopmental disorder (e.g., ADHD, autism, intellectual disability). Thanks to you, all of these children will benefit from the research advances made possible by this new imaging platform.

This year, your generosity will have made it possible to achieve an important milestone in brain health research: the establishment of a **pan-Canadian brain imaging platform**, developed by CHU Sainte-Justine, Toronto's SickKids hospital, and Alberta Children's Hospital.

By coordinating their efforts and state-of-the-art technologies, these three hospitals will produce the most accurate and comprehensive brain image bank to date. Spanning birth to late adolescence, the database will propel research and care across Canada.

A better understanding of the brain means a better understanding of **neurodevelopmental disorders**, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, sleep, learning, behaviour, the mechanisms behind addiction, and more—**all of which is valuable information for improving the care and support provided to millions of babies, children, and adolescents.** It is because of your generosity that we can provide this tremendous gift to current and future generations.

When a child falls ill, it is not only their body but also their entire family that feels the strain. Sheer worry can take a huge toll on parents, who may have to deal with everything from missed work days and frequent trips to the hospital to struggles with their mental health.

Once again this year, you, along with various other partners, have supported our Social Services team in its mission to **help the families of sick kids cope with day-to-day challenges.**

- **\$198,868** went toward ensuring their refrigerators were stocked upon their return from the hospital
- **\$117,164** went toward facilitating their numerous trips to Sainte-Justine (gas, parking, etc.)
- **\$19,030** went toward helping parents who stayed by their child's bedside get a good night's sleep

Dr. Alexandra Cambier • Better treat and prevent certain rare kidney diseases


You're helping protect children's kidneys

Food services

You're helping transform mealtimes for children

With the help of donors like you, the Délipapilles catering service revolutionized patient nutrition at Sainte-Justine a few years ago. Instead of set meals served at set times, kids can now order what they want, when they want it, allowing them to focus on what matters most: their recovery.

Délipapilles has **slashed food waste while vastly improving the satisfaction rate among families**. In light of this success, the Food Services team thought up a new project to further enhance their program: the creation of **a modern and easy-to-use digital ordering app**. With the help of your donations, the app was launched earlier this year.

A road to recovery paved in grilled cheese

The day after his liver transplant, during which 2 kilos of fluid were removed from his belly, 18-month-old Charly finally regained his appetite. Ever since, he's only wanted to eat one thing: Délipapilles grilled cheese—sometimes as many as eight per day! Thanks to the flexibility of the catering service, Charly can enjoy his favourite sandwiches at his convenience (i.e., between medical checkups) and as soon as he gets hungry.

With the new app you helped fund, other kids like Charly will also be able to have the meals they want, at convenient times in their schedule.



Thanks to you:

- Families will receive **better support** from dietary technicians, who will have fewer phone orders to manage.
- The **menu will be updated in real time**, as temporarily unavailable items will be removed from the app. This will further reduce food waste and **boost the satisfaction rate** among young patients, who will always get their first choice.
- Fewer paper menus will be produced, which will benefit future generations by **shrinking the hospital's ecological footprint**.
